Implementation Grants

In 2021, Lilly Endowment launched Indiana Youth Programs on Campus, an initiative designed to help Indiana colleges and universities in their efforts to create new or expand and enhance existing high-quality, on-campus programs for Hoosier youth, ages 5 - 18. Through this initiative, the Endowment has approved a total of \$22.6 million in planning grants and program implementation grants. Indiana public and private colleges and universities that have a physical campus were eligible to participate in the initiative.

The 27 colleges and universities listed below have received implementation grants. The Endowment anticipates making additional grants in September 2022.
