



# Pathways for Tomorrow Initiative

## Phase 3 Grants

Lilly Endowment Inc. has approved grants to help 16 theological schools launch large-scale collaborative programs focused on the preparation and support of pastoral leaders for Christian congregations. These grants represent the third and final phase of the Pathways for Tomorrow Initiative. Launched in 2021, the initiative aims to help theological schools in the United States and Canada strengthen their abilities to prepare ordained and lay pastoral leaders for Christian churches now and into the future.

The phase three grants range from \$4,999,792 to \$7,950,555, and will support large-scale collaborative efforts involving multiple theological schools, colleges, congregations, denominations, healthcare networks and other organizations. The Endowment believes these projects offer significant promise and can also serve as models for other theological schools.
